

Mittal Steel Pipes & Tubes Growth Timeline

1994

The Canadian steelmaker Sidbec, including its tubes plant which is now called LaSalle, was acquired from the Government of Québec.

1995

Acquisition of Karmet, one of the largest integrated single site steel plants in the world, located in Kazakhstan, including the tube mill Temirtau.

2001

Acquisition of Alfasid, including the pipe plant Annaba from the Algerian government. Acquisition from the Romanian government of the steelmaker Sidex, an integrated Steelwork, that also comprises large outside diameter LSAW pipe mill named, Galati.

2003

In Czech Republic, the acquisition of steelmaker Nova Hut, that also comprises the Ostrava and Karvina pipes and tubes mills. The group bought the Iasi pipes & tubes making facility in Romania, formerly known as Tepro.

2004

Acquisition of Polskie Huty Stali from the Polish government. This group of steelworks included the tube mill in Kraków. The group acquired the pipes & tubes making facility of Roman in Romania, formerly known as Petrotub.

2005

Creation of the Mittal Steel Pipes & Tubes entity, consisting of the above mention units

2006

Commissioning of the Aktau spiral welded pipes plant in Kazakhstan. Creation of the ArcelorMittal Pipes & Tubes division

2007

Announcement of Greenfield project for seamless pipes in Jubail, Saudi Arabia. Merger of Dofasco Tubular Products and ArcelorMittal Pipes & Tubes organizations

Most recent developments

Integration of former ArcelorMittal Pipes & Tubes and former Dofasco Tubular Products, thereby creating the Tubular Products Division of ArcelorMittal.

Acquisition of former Vallourec Précision Soudage and Vallourec Composants Automobiles Vitry with plants in Chevillon, Hautmont and Vitry le François.

Announcement of the Greenfield project for a LSAW mill in Calabar, Nigeria.

Acquisition of Unicon, the leading manufacturer of welded steel pipes in Venezuela with six units across the country.
